

#### MED:

Always structured

### Structured vs Individual



#### **Individual**

- Registration required to check and verify that the admission requirements are fulfilled!
- No additional requirements, only writing of the thesis itself

#### **Structured**

- Registration required to check and verify that the admission requirements are fulfilled!
- MINT: Exposé, progress reports, Good Scientific Practice and ethics courses + courses depending on your programme
- MED: Exposé, mandatory supervision meetings, 6 CP (including Good Scientific Practice course) [→]

### Registration

#### **MINT:**

- 1. Enroll at the Student Service Center (SSC) or International Office [➡]
- 2. Check your admission requirements for the doctorate at the MINT office [➡]
  -> You will need proof that you have been admitted!
- 3. Only then, register at the CDSL¹ [►]
- 4. Hand in supervision agreement at the CDSL¹ [➡]

#### MED:

University of Lübeck - PhD council

- 1. Enroll at the Student Service Center (SSC) or International Office [➡]
  - does not apply if you are enrolled as a student
- 2. Register your doctoral project at the Doctoral Office Medicine [►]
  -> You will need proof that your project has been accepted!
- 3. Only then, register at the CDSL $^1$  [ $\Longrightarrow$ ]
- 4. Hand in supervision agreement at the CDSL¹ [➡]

#### The thesis



#### MINT:

- No cumulative dissertation
  - published works can be used within the thesis
- Length and other requirements should be discussed with your supervisor
- Usually, at least one published paper is required for a "summa cum laude"
- The thesis itself can be written in either German or English
  - But abstract must be included in German <u>and</u>
     English. Further information: [➡]

#### MED:

- Cumulative dissertation allowed
  - at least 3 journal articles, one first authorship
- Length and other requirements should be discussed with your supervisor
- Usually, at least one published paper is required for a "summa cum laude"
- Usually, the thesis is written in German.
   Upon justified application, dissertations in English may also be admitted
  - But detailed 4 pages German summary of the dissertation required! Further information: [➡]

### **Application**



#### **MINT**

- Contact the MINT office 6 months before the planned submission date!
- Required documents (excerpt!)
  - 4 hard copies of the thesis
  - Outline
  - CV
  - List of publications
  - a police clearance certificate of the applicant no older than one year sent directly to the MINT office by the authority
- Full information in § 9 of the Doctorate regulations! [➡]

#### **MED**

- Required documents (excerpt!)
  - 6 hard copies of the thesis
  - Outline
  - 6 hard copies of the publications relevant to your thesis
  - CV
  - a police clearance certificate of the applicant no older than one year sent directly to the MED office by the authority
- Full information in § 12 of the Doctorate regulations! [➡]

### Defence/Colloquium



#### **MINT**

- German or English
- Within 3 months after application
- Max. overall duration 80 minutes
- 20 minutes presentation of the thesis findings
- 20 minutes questions from the examiners and audience (max. 10min)
- 40 minutes questions from the examiners without the audience

#### **MED**

- German or English
- Within 3 months after application
- Max. overall duration 60 minutes
- 10 minutes presentation of the findings of the thesis. No Slides and other materials
- Questions from the examiners

#### And then?



• Handing in final copies of the dissertation for publication

- Waiting time until the final certificate arrives is usually multiple months
  - Additional months with "summa cum laude" procedure
  - No use of the academic grade until the certificate arrives!
  - Usually unproblematic for e.g. applications
  - Preliminary certificates available, if needed

### Important institutions (1/2)



- Student Service Center (SSC)
  - Manages your enrolment
  - You must re-enroll each semester!
- Center for Doctoral Studies (CDSL)
  - Manages the structured programmes
  - Offers courses
  - Offers advice and mediation for problems and conflicts
- MINT/MED doctoral office
  - Responsible for organization of the doctoral procedure
  - Submission of the dissertation there
  - Remember the checking of the requirements!

### Important institutions (2/2)



- Doctorate Commission MED and MINT (=SAMINT)
  - Carries out the doctoral procedure
  - Decides on the "summa cum laude" grade
- PhD-council
  - Peer-level support regarding everything related to doctoral studies
  - Representation of doctoral students' interests
  - Providing personal and professional networking opportunity




